Dear Philadelphia Water Customer:

You are receiving this letter as a notification that a Water Department construction job is soon to begin in your neighborhood. Our work will take place soon on the blocks listed below, and as a neighbor in this community we want you to be aware of possible traffic disruptions and delays while this work is ongoing.

This project is part of the overall green infrastructure program called *Green City, Clean Waters*, implemented by the City of Philadelphia to improve the stormwater management of your neighborhood. Green stormwater infrastructure includes a range of soil-water-plant systems that intercept storm water, infiltrate a portion of it into the ground, evaporate a portion of it into the air, and in some cases release a portion of it slowly back into the sewer system.

Prior to work starting on each of these blocks, residents directly impacted by this work will receive an additional hand delivered letter to their home alerting them that work is soon to begin. This project will take place at these locations:

Planned Green Infrastructure



Project #50133 is a project part of a larger Lawncrest package, with several projects over the next 5 to 7 years to vastly improve the stormwater overflow management in the Lawncrest area. This work will be done all over the city for the next 15 years.

PWD is working to have each of these projects work together congruently, and each project will have different timelines and may have different points of contact. Work is currently ongoing for **50125 SE** and **50217 N**, both expected to be done by Winter 2022.
