Dear Philadelphia Water Customer,

I am writing to let you know that the Philadelphia Water Department (PWD) is planning a construction project in your neighborhood. The planned project will take place **on your street and on the sidewalks near your property.**

This project is a part of the City of Philadelphia's *Green City, Clean Waters* initiative — a program that keeps pollution out of rivers and creeks by using green tools to absorb stormwater that would normally overflow into our waterways during heavy storms. As part of the **Shunk Street Bumpouts (#50219) project,** PWD is planning to install the following green tools at the following locations:

- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S 12th St to S Sartain St (west end)
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S Sartain St to S Jessup St (east end)
- Subsurface Trench on Shunk St from S Jessup St to S 11th St
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S 11th St to S Warnock St (west end)
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S Warnock St to S Alder St (east end)
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S Alder St to S 10th St (east end)
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S 8th St to S Franklin St (west end)
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S Franklin St to S Beulah St (east end)
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S Beulah St to S 7th St (east end)
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S 7th St to S Sheridan St (west end)
- Subsurface Trench on Shunk St from S Sheridan St to S Marshall St
- Stormwater Bumpout on Shunk St from S Marshall to S 6th St (east end)

Construction is expected to begin in approximately **2-6 months**. However, **please note that this is an estimate and the construction start date can be earlier or later than the anticipated timeline**.
