# **57th Street Corridor**

# Why are we doing this project?

Regulations require Philadelphia to reduce the amount of pollution entering our rivers when excess stormwater (rain and melting snow) causes dirty water and diluted sewage to spill into our waterways. This site is part of the City of Philadelphia's *Green City, Clean Waters* program.

### **Green City, Clean Waters**

The City's *Green City, Clean Waters* program uses green tools and other infrastructure improvements to soak up and manage stormwater runoff. Green tools use materials such as plants, soil, stone, and special pavement to capture, slow, filter, and soak up water during storms.

### **Project #50271 57th Street Corridor**

Project #50271 57th Street Corridor will implement green tools in the Overbrook Park neighborhood In West Philadelphia. The infrastructure installed will include stormwater bumpouts and tree trenches, subsurface stone storage, and new stormwater piping.

The completed project will also provide beautification to the area, including new concrete footways, landscaping upgrades, and ADA-compliant ramps and pavements.

Coordination with existing utilities (PECO, PGW, and Verizon) and SEPTA will be on-going during the construction. Residents living on/near affected streets will receive a letter prior to this work starting.




