Dear Philadelphia Water Customer,

I am writing to let you know that the Philadelphia Water Department (PWD) is **planning a construction project** in your neighborhood. This stormwater management project will take place in the public right of way (streets, sidewalks, and parks) near your property.

This project is a part of the **City of Philadelphia's** *Green City, Clean Waters* **initiative** – a 25-year plan to improve the quality of our waterways by installing green stormwater infrastructure (GSI) in our neighborhoods, coupled with traditional infrastructure like collection, pumping, and wastewater treatment plant enhancements. These 'green tools' installed in your area will absorb stormwater that would normally overflow into our local creeks, streams, and rivers during heavy storms. As part of this construction work, which is called **GSI Project #50222 48th & Warrington**, PWD is planning to install the green tools listed below at the following locations:

- A cluster of stormwater bumpouts, stormwater subsurface storage systems, and stormwater tree trenches north of the train tracks and south of Baltimore Avenue, approximately from Thomas Avenue to 50th Street
- A smaller cluster of stormwater tree trenches on streets north of the Kingsessing Recreation Center, approximately nearby 47th Street & Springfield Avenue and 48th & Chester Avenue


