Dear Philadelphia Water Customer,

I am writing to let you know that the Philadelphia Water Department (PWD) is planning three (3) construction projects in your neighborhood. The planned projects and their project pages are:

- Lawndale Streets West (#50247): water.phila.gov/50247
- Levick Edge (#50238): <u>water.phila.gov/50238</u>
- Lawndale Streets East (#50221): water.phila.gov/50207

These projects are a part of the City of Philadelphia's *Green City, Clean Waters* initiative – a program that keeps pollution out of rivers and creeks by using green tools to absorb stormwater that would normally overflow into our waterways during heavy storms. As part of these projects, PWD is planning to install the following green tools:

- Stormwater Tree Trenches
- Stormwater Infiltration Trenches
- Stormwater Bumpouts

Construction is expected to begin in various stages throughout the next year. However, please note that this is an estimate and the construction start date can be earlier or later than the anticipated timeline.

Each project will have its own inspector and construction team, as well as a specific project timeline. PWD will provide that information in a follow up letter closer to the time of construction.
